CLASSROOM SETUP





Figure 1. Layout of a typical ITV classroom.

LECTURES

- STOP EVERY 10 MINUTES TO ASK QUESTIONS OR TO DO ANOTHER ACTIVITY
- USE INTERACTIVE STUDY MATERIALS, FOR REVIEW AND NOTE TAKING
- ASK QUESTIONS ON THE TOPIC TO SPECIFIC STUDENTS DURING THE LECTURE TO KEEP STUDENT ON THEIR TOES
- COMMUNICATE APPROACHABILITY NON-

- RECORDER OR SPEAKER OF THE GROUP




