Staff clarified that after receipt of the complaint, Ms. Trujillo’s LinkedIn profile was obtained independently by staff, who found that the online profile was active and incorrectly identified Trujillo as presently employed as an RN.

The total funding request of \$599,447 represents the amount of grant funding that is short in covering all costs of the CNA program.
