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**I. Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 a.m., Thursday, July 23, 2015.

The following Board members were present: Quinn, McCormies, Berrigan, Gutierrez, Machesky, Busby, Logue and Dale.

Quinn presided.

Quinn welcomed members of the audience, explained the procedure for addressing the Board, and stated the mission of the Board.

**VI.L.1. Karen Faye Erazo RN159470 (Dahn)**

Attorney Rob Chelle was present and addressed the Board. McCormies moved, Gutierrez seconded, and it was unanimously carried to issue a Letter of Concern for applying a 25ug Fentanyl patch to "Patient A" every 24 hours instead of every 72 hours as ordered by the physician, placing the patient at risk for over sedation, respiratory depression and possibly death.

**VI.Q.1. Renee Elizabeth Franzen RN160700 (Harrington)**

Attorney Rob Chelle was present and addressed the Board. Harrington addressed the Board and confirmed receipt of additional information. Quinn moved, McCormies seconded, and after discussion it was unanimously carried to continue the investigation to allow Respondent the opportunity to complete the evaluation started by Dr. Jacquelyn St. Germaine. If the evaluation is not completed, based upon the findings of fact and statute/rule violations identified in the investigative report, amended to include: if not completed in 40 days Issue Notice of Charges.

**VII.B.9. Board Educational Presentation: Bridge Course for Veteran’s and LPN Refresher Students Summary Report-Dr. Margi Schultz & Gateway Faculty (Information-20 minutes)**

Margie Schultz, Gateway Community College’s Division Chair. Department: Nursing Division, and faculty members Nancy Dawn, Jerry Lastine and Pat Novak presented educational information on the Bridge Course for Veteran’s and LPN Refresher Students. This program was started as a result of House Bill 2076. Initial focus included identifying what the graduate of this program would look like, what they would be capable of doing, and looking at the diversity of the students they would get from multiple branches of the different services. A gap analysis was key to identifying the knowledge base at entry and then comparing it to the curriculum. The faculty identified the “nice to know” and “need to know” aspects and determined the content needed to focus on the “Need to know,” since the program was only 8 didactic credits and 4 clinical credits. Clinical areas include long term care, acute care, pediatrics, and obstetrics. Twenty-five percent of the current curriculum is online. They found that the veterans preferred more classroom instruction and subsequently decreased the online time. Fifty graduates have completed the program so far. Students are encouraged to then enroll in the RN program. Many take the NCLEX-PN. They have had only one failure so far. Gateway is also talking with 3 other colleges in Arizona that have expressed interest in providing a similar class. Schultz emphasized the need to have dedicated

faculty for the program, and to devote adequate time for labs. Ridenour commended Schultz and the faculty for the work that they have done in making the Bridge program so successful.

Dale left the meeting at 2:00 p.m.

**VII.A.3. Presentation: Proposed Licensed Nurse Remediation Portfolio Pathway-Dr. Janine Hinton, P. Randolph, J. Dahn, T. Greabell (20 minutes-Discussion and Decision)**

Randolph noted that there have been refresher courses offered for many years, but they were finding it more difficult to remediate board ordered students due to their unique needs and requirements. Also the Board had no assurance that particular practice issues were addressed and remedied with the refresher course. Dr. Jeanine Hinton and Nick DeFalco presented information on the Licensed Nurse Remediation & Competency Assessment Pathway, a competency based program that is an alternative to a refresher course for remediating respondents. Components include:

- Validating basic nursing knowledge with HESI-Exit testing, followed by a HESI prescribed remediation package, based on their performance.
- A basic skill competency course which consists of at least 4 randomly selected basic care skills and a medication administration skill test, including video self- modeling.
- Comprehensive assessment of nursing by requiring the nurse to perform 3 basic med/surg simulations. This can be adjusted to the nurse's interest.
- A course on "The Deteriorating Patient" with focus on critical thinking, team-work, and communication as an adult med/surg patient is exhibiting signs of deterioration.

It is anticipated the courses would take at least 6 months, but will also depend on the student's motivation and practice.

Board members asked that the title of the course be changed to Competency Based Refresher Program.

Board members asked if a nurse could take only one part of the course Hinton and Randolph replied that this was meant to be a comprehensive, competency based program and that if a nurse were competent in some aspects, they would be able to move quicker through the course. Due to the complexity and interrelatedness of nursing performance, the whole course would be necessary.

Quinn moved, McCormies seconded, and it was unanimously carried to approve the proposed Competency-based Refresher Program as an alternative to successful completion of a nurse refresher course.

The objective of National Council’s Taxonomy of Error, Root Cause Analysis and Practice Responsibility (TERCAP) project is “to establish an adverse event reporting database to identify factors associated with practice breakdown” Arizona has been contributing TERCAP cases since 2008 and is recognized as one of the highest contributors of cases.

**VII.A.6. NCSBN Annual Delegate Assembly Meeting August 18-21, 2015; Summary of Recommendations- Proposed Revisions to Model Act & Rules; Proposed Revision to 2016 RN Test Plan; Slate of Candidates 2015; Online Delegate Orientation through Interactive Courses- Randolph/Ridenour**

Randolph addressed the Board with information of proposed revision to the Model Act and Rules by APRN Distance Learning Education Committee addressing the issues Member Boards have expressed related to the regulation of distance education programs for APRNs. The committee developed guidelines for APRN distant education programs similar to guidelines developed in 2014 for prelicensure distant education nursing programs. The current proposal is that faculty who only teach didactic course or who have programmatic oversight, but no involvement with patient care, should be licensed where the APRN program is regulated. Randolph expressed concerns related to lack of jurisdiction over faculty teaching clinical courses through distance means in Arizona, given the increased number of substantiated complaints against faculty licenses.
