**VII.A.4. 2016 Arizona Legislative Session – Bills Impacting Nursing Regulation: Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact; APRN Bill; HB 2501 Centralization of Health Regulatory Board and other potential Nursing Regulation Bills – Harris**

Harris address the Board. The legislature has been discussing action on the Board’s evaluation program, the posting of Board actions on the Board’s website, and the burden of proof for disciplinary actions. So far he has not seen any bills on these issues, but anticipates something will be introduced related to website postings and evaluations.

The APRN measure is in the process of being drafted and may be introduced soon. He will be active in assisting with the smooth implementation. Quinn indicated that the Medical Association has some concerns about certification, as opposed to licensure, but Harris said that to him, the process of licensure and certification is the same.

Harris is following discussions at the Governor’s Office, and involving Representative Carter, related to an effort to streamline, not “consolidate,” healthcare boards and commissions, and have all eventually come under the Department of Health Services. Non-healthcare boards may likewise have a single overseeing agency at some point. The stated purpose is to ensure that boards comprised of active market participants, which make decisions that may impact competition, have safeguards to avoid antitrust issues, pursuant to recent case law. There were questions about how the proposed bill would serve that purpose, and Harris said discussions today at the capitol may address those questions. Harris also stated that it is his impression that the goal was to move the whole Board to DHS, not to lose the expertise of the individual boards, and to allow this Board to continue to fulfill its mission to protect the patients and the public.

Berrigan moved, Logue seconded, and it was unanimously carried to reopen Agenda Item VII.A.4. Smith announced news regarding the Enhanced Nurse Licensure Compact Bill which will be officially posted on February 2, 2016.

**IX. Dialogue with Nursing Students**

The Board members and staff dialogued with Grand Canyon University nursing students regarding Board functions, policies and procedures. Questions were asked on:

- Importance to keep address current with the Board
- Advisement to students by Board members to answer application questions truthfully
- Social Media
- The consequences of a DUI
- Importance of integrity
- Difference between Arizona Nurses Association and Board of Nursing.

**VIII. Call to the Public**

**A public body may make an open call to the public during a public meeting, subject to reasonable time, place and manner restrictions, to allow individuals to address the public body on any issue within the jurisdiction of the public body. The Board may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda. Members of the public body shall not discuss or take legal action on matters raised during an open call to the public unless the matters are properly noticed for discussion and legal action. A.R.S. § 38-431.01(G).**
