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Nursing Assistant Training Program Laboratory Supplies List

(Revised 5/2018)

Under R4-19-802(D)(2) nursing assistant training programs are required to have all items needed to teach each required skill. The checklist below is provided to assist programs in obtaining and maintaining the required equipment. The nursing assistant training program must ensure that equipment and supplies are in functional condition and sufficient in number for each enrolled student to practice required skills

The following list details expectations for the provision of supplies and equipment.

<input type="checkbox"/> Hospital Bed	Working brakes and ability to raise and lower	No side rails are used for NA state test. If bed has side rails, work with rails down. Recommend having 1 bed unit per 4-5 students.

<input type="checkbox"/> Linens	<input type="checkbox"/> Flat and fitted sheets <input type="checkbox"/> Towels <input type="checkbox"/> Bedspread <input type="checkbox"/> Pillowcases <input type="checkbox"/> Washcloths <input type="checkbox"/> Bedspread	These are all required
<input type="checkbox"/> Linen Protectors		Mattress pad is used for the peri-care skills

<input type="checkbox"/> Privacy Curtain		May be curtain on a full or half-track or privacy screen
<input type="checkbox"/> Call Light		May be real or simulated, e.g. computer mouse cord

<input type="checkbox"/> Thermometers	Hand held digital	Oral is used in the state test; may also have rectal, tympanic. NO mercury thermometers.

<input type="checkbox"/> Stethoscopes (Including Teaching Stethoscopes)	Single stethoscope and a double teaching stethoscope is required	
<input type="checkbox"/> Aneroid Blood Pressure Cuff <input type="checkbox"/> Digital Blood pressure cuff

<input type="checkbox"/> Scale		Can be any type of scale suitable to weigh a patient.
<input type="checkbox"/> Manikin or Model	The model may be a full manikin or a peri-care task trainer (model) containing only the peri region, portions of the torso and legs. Needs to be anatomically correct for both male and female (can have interchangeable parts).	If a full manikin is purchased, consider a light weight model rather than full weight (about 180 pounds). Anatomically correct male/ female perineal models are also available.

<input type="checkbox"/> Feeding supplies & Dietary needs	<input type="checkbox"/> Cups <input type="checkbox"/> Glasses (clear, sizes 120 and 240 ml) <input type="checkbox"/> Dishes <input type="checkbox"/> Straws <input type="checkbox"/> Standard utensils <input type="checkbox"/> Adaptive utensils <input type="checkbox"/> Clothing protectors	D&S has standard cups available; Diet cards; food items such as single serving pudding, apple sauce, etc.

<input type="checkbox"/> Documentation Forms	Documentation of care; I&O forms; vital signs measurements	D&S has these forms to print out from their website
Other needed supplies	<input type="checkbox"/> Alcohol base hand sanitizer <input type="checkbox"/> Alcohol wipes	Some skills require hand sanitizer Alcohol wipes are used to clean thermometers
